NewFunds S&P GIVI SA Industrial 25 ETF replicates the price* performance of the S&P GIVI SA Industrials Index, an Index which represents the twenty-five stocks from the S&P GIVI SA composite having a GICS sector classification of industrials with the highest intrinsic value and lower volatility, subject to certain constraints such liquidity and market capitalisation of stocks.

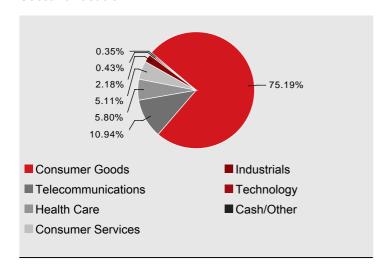

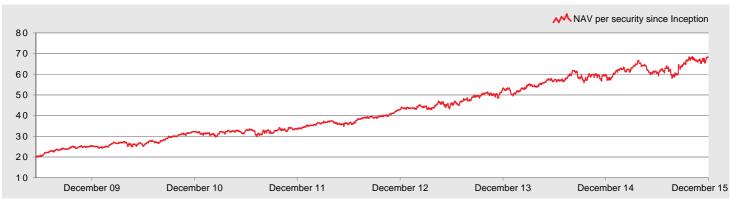
Sector allocation*

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Notes

- 1. The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is a measure of the ETFs assets that have been sacrificed as payment for services rendered (allowable charges per prescribed industry standards) in the management of the ETF(the TER excludes brokerage and transactional costs), expressed as a percentage of the daily average value of the portfolio and calculated over a 12 month rolling period.
